FOREWORD AND CONTENTS

This collection includes a graded sequence of unison and 2-part anthems written for church children's choirs, grades 3-6. It is designed to serve the church year while providing a step-by-step approach to part-singing for young voices. Beginning with a simple unison anthem appropriate for early autumn, it progresses through the church year with a succession of anthems that gradually introduces and reinforces independent part-singing. Additionally, these anthems offer an introduction to basic music literacy as well as opportunities for the development of good diction, basic musicianship, and ensemble singing.

A Singer's Edition specifically designed for young singers is available separately, No. 11476. Each anthem is presented with vocal parts only (no keyboard). The Singer's Edition also includes important instructional information presented in an easy, accessible manner for children, including the following:

- An introduction to basic music notation and terminology
- · Relevant music history and choral forms
- Pronunciation of simple Latin vowels and common English diphthongs

The following Table of Contents presents the basic concepts and natural progression found in this anthology. Tips for teaching these anthems may be found in the Director's Guide (pp. 36-38). The Index found on pages 39-40 includes additional anthems that may be useful in developing partsinging in young voices while serving the liturgical year.
