FOREWORD

The Living Crèche is a joyous musical celebration that weaves scripture, ancient legend, and carols from around the world into a richly colored Christmas tapestry. Drawing upon scriptural narrative extending from the advent prophecies through the wise men's visit, it illustrates the Christmas story with continuously unfolding carols, including fourteen arranged for choir or vocal solo and nine that accompany the narrative. Included are popular favorites such as "Silent Night," "The Holly and the Ivy," and "Angels from the Realms of Glory," as well as lesser known but equally appealing tunes including the haunting Czech lullaby "Rocking," the spirited annunciation tune "The Angel Gabriel from Heaven Came," and the charming English carol of the animals, "The Friendly Beasts."

Threading through this fabric are Christmas legends that trace modern customs to their Christian origins (e.g., The Legend of the First Christmas Tree; The Legend of Saint Nicholas) or that separate fact from commonly-accepted fiction (e.g., The Legend of the Three Wise Men). In this way, the authors have attempted to return to their Christian origins many contemporary Christmas customs that have been secularized through the evolution of modern practices.

The Living Crèche is approximately thirty-five minutes long and may be presented in two formats:

•A Christmas Pageant — A simply-staged Christmas nativity scene that "comes to life" as each of the central characters in the Christmas story enters the sanctuary or auditorium, processes to the front, and takes its place in the crèche. Directors are encouraged to be creative, developing costumes, adding characters and props, and/or painting a backdrop for the nativity scene. Alternate carol tunes or arrangements may be added or substituted. The Endnotes contain a list of sources that may be especially useful for the staging of pageant presentations. Many of these sources are readily available in public and college libraries.

•A Service of Lessons and Carols — Without staging, an inspiring worship service in which scripture, legend, and song combine to "bring to life" the Christmas story. Directors using this format may wish to use only the sub-title (The Christmas Story in Scripture, Legend, and Song) in printed programs.

In either case, **The Living Crèche** may be performed by S.A.T.B. chorus, soloists, and two or more narrators but may also include a unison children's chorus and congregational singing. A section for congregational participation appears on pages 70-71 and may be reprinted as necessary to the presentation of this work. Several accompaniment options are available, including:

- keyboard only (included in the choral score)
- keyboard and 3-octave handbells (handbells available separately, No. 12242)
- keyboard and chamber orchestra (parts for 2 violins, viola, cello [+opt. bass], flute, oboe, clarinet, percussion, 2 trumpets, 2 trombones [+opt. tuba], and director's score available separately, No. 12243)
- fully-orchestrated performance/accompaniment CD (available separately, No. 11874)

This work is also available in an edition adapted for children, grades K-6. Titled **The Living Crèche Children's Christmas Pageant**, it features unison vocals, a fully-supportive accompaniment, and easy speaking parts and may be performed by as few as 15-20 children or by much larger groups:
