

**Lord of All Creation** is a general anthem that may be especially appropriate for harvest or Thanksgiving, Christ the King Sunday, or Ascension. Suggested corresponding lectionary readings include Psalm 145, John 13: 31-35, Acts 14: 8-18, and Revelation 21: 1-6. One basic homiletical theme is praising the Alpha and Omega, the Beginning and the End, the Creator God, from whom all blessings flow.

This lovely anthem celebrates God's creation with beautiful text images. In rehearsal, strive for clearly articulated text and uniform vowels, which will enhance intonation. Be careful with the cut-offs at the ends of phrases such as mm. 5-8. The sustaining voices should listen very carefully for the moving voices, cutting off and breathing as one voice! Carefully tune the rich harmonies in mm. 31-34. As the altos, tenors, and basses descend into their lower registers, they should be careful not to "push" the sound, which will result in poor intonation. Rather, they should sing with a more brightly focused sound. This anthem should be performed with some freedom of motion throughout, guided by a strong sense of the underlying eighth note pulse.


