O SING THIS ANTHEM, SONG OF PRAISE

For Christ the King Sunday, Ascension or General Services

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Quick-and-Easy Rehearsal Suggestions

O SING THIS ANTHEM, SONG OF PRAISE is a general anthem that may be especially appropriate for Christ the King Sunday or Ascension. Suggested corresponding lectionary readings include Psalms 93 and 97, Jeremiah 23: 1–6, John 17: 20–26 and 18: 33–37, Acts 16: 16–34, and Revelation 1: 4b–8 and 22: 12–20. One basic homiletical theme is that Jesus is King, the Lord of all creation.

In Rehearsal:

- As the singers silently read along, play the anthem at performance tempo with artful dynamics and phrasing. If the cued vocal pitches are to be performed, assign them.
- Sing the anthem on a neutral syllable such as "naw."
- Repeat the anthem on "naw" while carefully tuning the ascending and descending scales. Instruct the singers to sing big steps ascending and small steps descending in order to compensate for the downward pull of gravity.
- After pitch and intonation are secure, sing the text with sensitive declamation.
- This anthem should be performed very legato, with a basic feeling of two pulses per measure.

ON A NIGHT OF WONDER is appropriate for Advent or, with the substitution of the italicized text, Christmas. Suggested corresponding lectionary readings for Advent include Isaiah 7: 10–14, Romans 1: 1–7 and Matthew 1: 18–24; one basic homiletical theme is preparing for the birth of the Messiah, sent from heaven by God to bring salvation to the earth. Suggested corresponding lectionary readings for Christmas include Isaiah 9: 1–6, Titus 2: 11–14 and Luke 2: 1–14; one basic homiletical theme is that the Child born this holiest of nights is Emmanuel, the Son of God.

In Rehearsal:

- As the singers silently read along, play the anthem at performance tempo with artful dynamics and phrasing. If the cued vocal pitches are to be performed, assign them.
- Sing the anthem on a focused neutral syllable such as "noo."
- Repeat mm. 19–26 on "noo," carefully tuning each chord. Sagging intonation can occur in passages with many repeated notes. Caution the singers to think of each repeated pitch as being slightly higher than the previous pitch.
- After pitch and intonation are secure, sing the text with sensitive declamation.
- This anthem should be performed very legato with a strong feeling of the underlying eighth-note pulse.


