Here I Am, Lord is one of the most popular hymns written in the last quarter of the twentieth century. It was composed by Daniel L. Schutte and is arranged in this edition for S.A.T.B. voices by Anna Laura Page. Appropriate for worship throughout the year, this anthem may be especially appropriate for communion, Epiphany, Lent or stewardship. Suggested corresponding lectionary readings include Psalm 138, Isaiah 6: 1-8, Luke 5: 1-11 and 1 Corinthians 15: 1-11. One basic homiletical theme is answering the call to follow Jesus, whose suffering and triumph were for our salvation.

In rehearsal, strive for a majestic legato imbued with the forward motion of the underlying eighth note pulse. Sing mm. 25-36 and 95-108 slightly faster, with a growing sense of urgency and commitment. In mm. 60-72, the canon between the women's and men's voices should be clearly articulated as the "voice of the people respond to God's call." The grand postlude (mm. 110-end) is a splendid affirmation by God's people, triumphantly sounding the message, "Here I am!"
