Mary, How Could You Have Known is an anthem for Advent or Christmas. Suggested corresponding lectionary readings include Isaiah 7: 10-16, Matthew 1: 18-25, Luke 1: 26-38 & 46-56 and Romans 1: 1-7. One basic hombletical theme is the fulfillment of prophecy: a virgin will conceive and bear a Son, Emmanuel, God with us.

Sing this poignant anthem with very flowing phrases and great sensitivity to text. Especially in mm. 29-37, avoid the temptation to sing "note-for-note." Instead, strive for a feeling of two pulses per measure.
