

Hallelujah! Resurrection Morning! is a gospel anthem for Easter and Eastertide. Suggested corresponding lectionary readings include Psalm 118: 14-24, Luke 24: 1-12, John 20: 1-18, Acts 10: 34-43 and 1 Corinthians 15: 19-26. One basic homiletical theme is spreading the good news of the dawning of salvation in the resurrection of our Lord, Jesus Christ.

In rehearsal, strive for a bright, intensively focused, energetic choral sound. Practice singing the entire anthem on staccato “doo” until the rhythms are secure and syncopations are precisely aligned throughout the voice parts. Avoid over-singing, which will cause the tempo to slow and the intonation to suffer.

Mary Kay Beall is a church musician and widely-published lyricist and composer with degrees from Ohio Wesleyan University, Ohio State University and Trinity Lutheran Seminary. A frequent collaborator with composers throughout the country, she is best known for her creative partnership with her husband, John Carter, with whom she has written numerous anthems, children’s musicals and sacred cantatas.

Lloyd Larson is a free-lance composer living in Minneapolis, Minnesota. Formerly the Associate Pastor for Music and Worship at Meadow Park Church in Columbus, Ohio, he is an ordained minister and widely-published composer. Larson earned a B.A. from Anderson (IN) University and an M.C.M. from Southern Baptist Theological Seminary in Louisville, Kentucky.
