His Beautiful Hands is a hauntingly powerful message for Ash Wednesday, Lent and Holy Week, especially Good Friday. Suggested corresponding scripture readings include Psalm 22, Isaiah 53, Matthew 8: 1-4 & 9: 27-31, Luke 23: 44-46 and John 20: 24-29. One basic homiletical theme is the healing power of faith.

In rehearsal, strive for uniform timbre and a strong sense of the underlying pulse. Carefully inflect the dramatic text, and avoid the tendency to sing "note-for-note."

Carl Nygard, Jr. is Vocal Music Director at Fleetwood Area High School in Fleetwood, Pennsylvania. A graduate of West Chester (Pa.) State University with degrees in education and music composition, he is active as a guest conductor and adjudicator and is a recipient of the ASCAP Standard Award. His compositions have been performed by the Mormon Tabernacle Choir and the Cleveland Orchestra Chorus.

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
