

Joyful, Joyful, We Adore Thee is a soulful gospel arrangement of Beethoven's immortal chorus, *Hymn to Joy*. Opening slowly with an ad lib vocal solo, it segues into an upbeat, driving gospel chorus full of blues harmonies, punctuated syncopations, and a marvelous keyboard accompaniment that is a joy to play.

Available in three voicings for singers of all ages, this arrangement of **Joyful, Joyful, We Adore Thee** is a great choice for both school and church choirs. It also features optional instrumental accompaniment, No. 23706, and a full performance/accompaniment recording, No. 23705, both available separately.

When performed by church choirs, suggested corresponding scripture readings include Psalms 19, 97 & 145, 2 Corinthians 2: 14, Ephesians 5: 15-21, Colossians 3: 12-17 and Revelation 22: 12-17. Suitable for performance throughout the year, it may be especially appropriate for Christmastide (especially Christmas Dawn), Eastertide and Lent.

Lloyd Larson is a free-lance composer living in Minneapolis, Minnesota. Formerly the Associate Pastor for Music and Worship at Meadow Park Church in Columbus, Ohio, he is an ordained minister and widely-published composer. Larson earned a B.A. from Anderson (IN) University and an M.C.M. from Southern Baptist Theological Seminary in Louisville, Kentucky.
