ENDNOTES

This cantata edition of the Christmas portion (plus the chorus *Hallelujah!*) of Handel's **Messiah** is designed to provide both worship services and school concerts with a very practical yet scholarly version of this popular work. **Handel's Christmas Messiah:** A **Cantata** includes the following unique characteristics:

- A practical length (approximately 30 minutes) that provides an opportunity for performances within a church service or school concert of modest length.
- Five choruses, complete and in their original keys, selected for their accessibility and for their roles in the unfolding drama.
- Four solos, one each for soprano, alto, tenor, and bass.
- The substitution of spoken narration for recitative, providing the pastor, lay reader, or school
 administrator the opportunity to partner with the musicians in conveying the Christmas
 story.
- A carefully revised keyboard accompaniment.
- An optional chamber orchestra accompaniment that is appropriate to the acoustic and resources of most sanctuaries and schools, including string quartet and bass, C-Instrument (oboe or flute), two Bb trumpets, timpani, and a continuo keyboard for organ, harpsichord, or piano.
- A newly engraved score that complies with modern notational practices.

In preparing this edition, an attempt has been made to incorporate the best of various historical editions as well as the most current music scholarship. To this end the editor has included in the score the notation of common Baroque performance practices, such as the double-dotting in the opening Sinfonia and some ornamentation. In shaping the narration and defining the appropriate performance length of this work, the editor has omitted most of the solos and all of the recitatives, with the exception of the famous bass recitative For Behold, Darkness Shall Cover the Earth. To this recitative the editor has added a five measure coda consisting of a repeat of the introduction. Appearing in unaltered form are the tenor air Every Valley Shall Be Exalted and the alto air (with chorus) O Thou That Tellest Good Tidings to Zion. The soprano solo Come Unto Him appears in Handel's original score as the second half of the alto/ soprano duet He Shall Feed His Flock Like a Shepherd. Borrowing the duet's coda, the editor has fashioned a four measure introduction for this solo. Two of the Christmas choruses are omitted: And He Shall Purify and His Yoke Is Easy, His Burthen Is Light. The Pifa ("Pastoral Symphony") is omitted, and the opening Sinfonia is abbreviated, presenting only the opening Grave section, to which an appropriate cadence has been added utilizing the final three measures of Handel's original. The parenthetical dynamic markings and all metronome markings are the editor's. The vocal lines of the five choruses appear as Handel wrote them so that singers may benefit from the experience of singing these inspiring choruses in their authentic forms, beloved throughout the centuries.
