PERFORMANCE NOTES

In "This Little Light of Mine", it is important to swing the ostinato bass clef part to create the basis for the "bluesy" feel of the arrangement. Take care that the techniques called for [martellato, thumb damp, ring touch] are performed cleanly and align directly with the bass clef line. It is important to damp the bells for the eighth rests which appear in the melodic line in measure 13, 15, and similar places, in order to provide the "lift" to the line.

The A6 chime part which appears in measure 30-38, might be more conveniently allocated to the bass clef as follows:

G4/A4 ringer also mallets B4 and C5 in this section. *B4/C5 ringer rings A6 chime C6/D6 ringer rings D6 chime E6/F6 ringer rings E6 chime G6/A6 ringer rings G6 chime B6/C7 ringer rings Bb6, B6, and C7 chimes
