Holy, Holy, Holy, is appropriate for Trinity Sunday and the Day of Pentecost as well as for All Saints' Day, Reformation Sunday, World Communion, and services focusing on stewardship. Suggested corresponding lectionary readings include Isaiah 6: 1-8 and Revelation 4: 8-11. Basic homilitical themes include the Triune Nature of God, God as Sovereign of Creation, and humankind's response to God with adoration and allegiance.

Be careful to shape each intoning of the word "holy" with a stress on the first syllable. In general, 4-measure phrases should be observed. The a cappella verse (m. 41-55) may effectively be performed with keyboard doubling the voices.

Jay Althouse is an award-winning composer and arranger living in Hilton Head, South Carolina. A graduate of Indiana University of Pennsylvania, he has written many choral publications for both church and school.
