

## REHEARSAL NOTES

This lively arrangement of the hymn tune CWM RHONDDA (used most commonly with the texts “Guide Me, O Thou Great Jehovah” and “God of Grace and God of Glory”) expresses assurance that God will guide us according to his will. Be sure to emphasize the accented notes in the malleted accompaniment, which provide a rhythmic counterpoint to the more straightforward quarter-note rhythm of the melody. Bring out the melody when it moves into the lower register in measures 33–40. Start at a true piano dynamic at measure 53 to allow space to build effectively into the end section, which starts at the key change in measure 65. The flute part, while optional, contributes melodic counterpoint and interest to the arrangement; be sure to strive for a good interplay between flute and bells, bringing out the flute part when it doubles the melody and balancing appropriately elsewhere.
